Brief Summary:

Many of our majors come from 200-level classes, and by graduation they have not performed at the level they should. The department feels that students cannot achieve an appropriate level unless we require 3 more hours of instruction at the 200 level, a return to hours of instruction that we once had, and 3 more required hours at the 300-level. This change is especially urgent for our Teaching majors, who must meet NCATE standards, as explained on the F2 form for that program, but we feel strongly that all of our majors need to reach a higher level of language proficiency.

Student Learning:

We have been tracking student performance at the 200 level for several years and assessment data confirms what we see in the classroom; students who move from the 102 courses to 201 are not well prepared and generally the 200-level sequence is not preparing our students adequately for 300-level coursework at ISU and abroad. The combination of less hours both at the 100 level (4 hours) and at the 200 level (4 hours) since development of the new program is the likely cause. Exit outcome data that tracks four skills is yet a small pool, however it is clear that our current program was not designed to meet the advanced low standards now required by ACTFL.

Brief Summary:

In separate proposals, we have explained why we need to increase the proficiency of our language studies students in the Language Studies major and the Language Studies-Teaching major by adding 3 hours at the 200 level and 3 hours at the 300 level. (1) This change of necessity increases the number of hours in the minor by 3 hours because successful completion of a 300-level course in a language grants credit for the 200-level courses. (2) We believe our minors also need the higher proficiency of an extra 300-level course, so we are changing the requirement of 6 hours at the 300/400 level to 9 hours. (3) And the option to count one 100-level course toward the minor if it had a different prefix from the student's other courses turned out to be unworkable in DARS, causing confusion for students and their major advisors. Therefore, we are also proposing to do away with that option.

Student Learning:

Our assessment of students completing the 200-level has revealed that they have not reached the proficiency they should have. This low proficiency has affected the level of instruction possible at upper levels. We believe that our minors really need the proficiency of 3 extra hours at the 200 level and 3 more hours at the 300/400 level.
