Chemistry Minor (22-23 credits)

Brief Summary:

CHEM 321 is a required course in both the Chemistry major and minor. Prior to last year, it was a 4 credit course which included lecture and laboratory components. The department created 321L last year (1 credit) in order to move the laboratory component into a separate course, with the lecture component remaining in 321 (now 3 credits). Thus, the change would be credit neutral, and the content of 321 and 321L together would be the same as that of the old 4-credit 321 course. The intent was to require both 321 and 321L for the Chemistry major and for the minor, as all students need both the lecture and lab components of the course. At the time of the change to the course structure, 321L was inadvertently left out of the catalog description for the minor. It needs to be added to the minor in order to bring the course listing in line with the total number of credits and ensure that students take the course to get the necessary laboratory training.
