SCOTT COLLEGE OF BUSINESS: Organizational

MKTG 312 – Motorsports Marketing

3 credits

A comprehensive overview of marketing issues related to various aspects of motorsports. Each type of participant in the motorsports industry in terms of the participant's use of marketing principles and sponsorship is examined, as well as consumer behavior as it relates to motorsports fans.

Prerequisite: junior standing.

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES: Mathematics and Computer Science

MATH 122 - Analytic Geometry

4 credits

Coordinate geometry of two and three dimensions, conic sections, families of equations, graphing families of equations, isometries of the plane, polar coordinates, cylindrical coordinates, and spherical coordinates.

Prerequisites: appropriate placement examination (MAPLE T.A.) score, MATH 112, or consent of instructor.

Note: this course does not count toward the mathematics major or minor.

Change credits, description, and prerequisites to:

MATH 122 - Analytic Geometry

3 credits

Coordinate geometry of two dimensions including conic sections, families of equations and their graphs, polar coordinates, and higher order plane curves.

Prerequisites: appropriate placement examination score or MATH 112 and MATH 115.

MATH 333 - Differential Equations

3 credits

First order equations, exact equations, higher order equations, power series methods, variation of parameters, systems of equations, Laplace transform, existence, and uniqueness of solutions.

Prerequisites: MATH 131.

First order equations, exact equations, higher order equations, power series methods, variation of parameters, systems of equations, Laplace transform, existence, and uniqueness of solutions.

Prerequisites: MATH 231.

MUS 150 - Introduction to Musical Traditions I

3 credits

Historical survey of musical style in Western art music from the Middle Ages to the present, with emphasis on critical listening and score reading. Includes introduction to basic research and writing skills pertaining to music. The ability to read music is essential.

Note: Three class hours a week.
