COURSE REVISIONS

COLLEGE OF NURSING, HEALTH, AND HUMAN SERVICES: Department Baccalaureate Nursing Completion

NURS 322 - Research/Theoretical Basis for Nursing Practice

3 credits

The course focuses on examination and application of clinical scholarship through evidenced based practice. Emphasis is on skills for research applied to clinical practice.

Prerequisites: NURS 224, 226, 228, or consent of instructor; Pre- or co-requisites EPSY 302 or Health, Safety, and HLTH 340.

Note: Three classroom hours per week.

3 credits

Change prerequisites to:

NURS 322 - Research/Theoretical Basis for Nursing Practice

3 credits

The course focuses on examination and application of clinical scholarship through evidenced based practice. Emphasis is on skills for research applied to clinical practice.

Prerequisites: NURS 209, 218; and AHS 340 or EPSY 302

or

Prerequisites: NURS 208, 304, 224, 364; Prerequisite or co-requisite AHS 340 or EPSY 302

or

Prerequisites: NURS 300, 304; Prerequisite or co-requisite AHS 340 or EPSY 302

Note: Three classroom hours per week.

NURS 324 - Nursing Care of Adults II

5 credits

Expanded roles of the nurse are performed in hospital and community settings for adults and older adults. Expanded critical thinking and clinical judgment skills are applied to promote health and provide care for clients experiencing or recovering from complex illnesses.

Prerequisites: NURS 224, 309 and 218; or BIO 412, NURS 304, and successful completion of or concurrent enrollment in NURS 338.

Note: Three classroom hours and an average of six clinical hours per week.

Change prerequisites to:

NURS 324 - Nursing Care of Adults II

5 credits

Expanded roles of the nurse are performed in hospital and community settings for adults and older adults. Expanded critical thinking and clinical judgment skills are applied to promote health and provide care for clients experiencing or recovering from complex illnesses.

Prerequisites: NURS 224, 309 and 218

or

Prerequisites: NURS 208, NURS 338 and BIO 412

Note: Three classroom hours and an average of six clinical hours per week.

Brief Summary:

The curricular changes are intended to align the existing curriculum with the undergraduate baccalaureate nursing department traditional campus track and the campus accelerated 2nd degree track to reflect accrediting recommendations and to accommodate changes in the admission process for prospective students into the LPN/LVN to BS track.

Currently four courses in the LPN/LVN to BS track exist which must be completed through a credit by examination process as part of the validation of prior learning and are a prerequisite to enter the major after students are admitted to the university. In an effort to streamline the admission process into the university and major into one step rather than the existing two steps, the credit by examination courses have been moved into the major and students will be expected to complete these courses by examination as part of the initial requirements within the major prior to progressing beyond the first two nursing courses (NURS 208 and NURS 304) within the major. This will allow prospective transfer students to enroll into both the university and into the major in one step once they have demonstrated completion all of the prerequisite courses listed below.

The elimination of the NURS 106 credit by examination course is proposed as recommended by the nursing accreditation body. This course has already been removed from the curriculum from the traditional campus track, was never part of the campus accelerated 2nd degree track, and more accurately reflects the approximate emphasis of the mental health content on the national nursing licensure exam. The existing mental health course, NURS 338, was revised to reflect content and emphasis on the national licensure examination and was accepted by the nursing accreditation body as appropriate in the curriculum.

Additional proposed changes include the combining of the content from the current NURS 328 and NURS 330 credit by examination courses into NURS 364, a single credit by examination course. NURS 328 and NURS 330 are currently both 4 credit hours while the proposed change to NURS 364, a 6 credit hour course, reflects a reduction of two overall credit hours. NURS 328 and NURS 330 have already been combined into NURS 364 in the traditional campus track and

were never part of the accelerated 2nd degree track with the content always presented in NURS 364. NURS 364 more accurately reflects the approximate emphasis of the pediatric and obstetric content on the national nursing licensure exam. The existing combined pediatrics and obstetrics course, NURS 364, was revised to reflect content and emphasis on the national licensure examination and was accepted by the nursing accreditation body as appropriate in the curriculum.

The elimination of the information technology requirement is proposed. This requirement is no longer a university requirement and no courses are offered on campus to satisfy this requirement. To ensure that students have the necessary skills required to be successful in the major, technology aspects are part of the first nursing course required in the major (NURS 208).

Removal of AHS 111 or PE 101/PE 101L and the removal of ENG 305/305T from the major is also proposed. These courses are Foundational Studies requirements and must still be completed prior to graduation. It is the opinion of the department that these courses are necessary as part of the overall degree but are not needed specifically as part of the major.

Students must successfully complete all required prerequisite support courses prior to admission into the major.

Proof of current unencumbered licensure as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) or Licensed Vocational Nurse (LVN) is required as a prerequisite for admittance into the LPN to BS track along with other compliance items such as but not limited to professional liability insurance, national background check, proof on immunizations, and CPR certification.

The admission, progression, retention, dismissal and graduation policies may be found in the Student Handbook located on the Department of Baccalaureate Nursing Completion website.

Brief Summary:

D.H.Sc. students need to take a 3 cr. hr. health care systems course. When the program was developed, it was agreed that D.H.Sc. students would take a Physical Therapy course that satisfied this need. Recent events with the Physical Therapy program have forced them to reduce their health care systems course to a 2 cr. hr. offering. We are proposing to develop our own 3 cr. hr. health care systems course to replace the Physical Therapy offering.

Student Learning:

D.H.Sc. students were scheduled to take a 3 cr. hr. course (PHTH 841 Health Care Systems) outside of the department. That particular course has now been changed to a 2 cr. hr. offering. The health care systems course needs to be a 3 credit hour course. Housing a health care systems course (AHS 812) in our department will allow us to better control standards and objectives met by the course.

The Doctorate of Health Sciences (D.H.Sc.) program is distinguished by its interdisciplinary approach to graduate study. The program will prepare practicing health care professionals to assume leadership roles in the academic and/or clinical and research settings. The degree will also prepare graduates to develop and implement solutions to the health issues of our society and to teach in academic and clinical settings. The program requires the student to successfully complete a minimum of 48 credit hours of graduate work beyond a master's degree and to write and defend a doctoral dissertation (18 credit hours) as prescribed in the regulations of the College of Graduate and Professional Studies.
