FACULTY SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR JANUARY 16, 2001

The Faculty Senate Executive Committee met at 3:15 p.m. in the Hulman Memorial Student Union (HMSU), Room 227.

Interim Provost Hopkins updated the Committee on state funding concerns and compensation questions surrounding Distance Education courses. He noted that the special committee to deal with travel budget issues will meet with Administrative Affairs Committee members in time for a report to the Faculty Senate on January 25.

Chair Bell reported on his meetings with President Benjamin and others concerning state funding issues and constraints, noting that an anticipated state-level revenue shortfall posed serious problems for ISU, its programs, and its priorities.

The Committee discussed funding constraints and their likely effects on compression/compaction, base raises, and “bricks and mortar” needs.

The Committee received from R. Guell the latest CAAC “Locus of Control” document regarding the General Education Council and Coordinator, and agreed to make it an agenda item for the next meeting.

The Committee went into executive session with D. Hopkins to consider a personal matter.

D. Hopkins noted some proposed administrative changes. He assured members that all items would go before the Administrative Affairs Committee in a timely fashion.

After establishing that three of the curricular items on the agenda had been “fast tracked” and did not require Ex. Comm. Action, the Committee approved the remaining items: PHIL 200, MUS 341, and SOC 110 (all 7-0-0).

The Executive Committee next meets on Tuesday, January 23, 2001 in HMSU 227.
