ISU ARTS ENDOWMENT GRANTS

The submission deadline for Arts Endowment Grants for the 2001/2002 academic years is Monday, November 5, 2001. Past UAEC funding has been between \$15,000 and \$20,000. Grant awards typically range from \$2,000 to \$6,000 with the average being \$3,500.

Submit proposals involving original faculty work on creative projects that eventuate in performance, exhibitions, and publications. Projects that will not qualify are: student work, research or criticism of already existing works, or preparation and writing of textbooks and teaching materials.

FACULTY SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR SEPTEMBER 18, 2001

The Executive Committee met at 3:15 in Hulman Memorial Student Union (HMSU), Room 227.

President Benjamin reported on his recent meeting with the vice presidents and on agenda items being considered for the next Board of Trustees' meeting (10/5). He expressed an interest in further discussion of institutional effectiveness, Degree Link funding, travel budgets, domestic partner benefits, and the transitional process surrounding reorganization of the administrative structure of the University. He encouraged attendance at the General Faculty Meeting on Monday (9/24) at 3 p.m. in Dede II.

Provost Pontius announced that the revised UNIVERSITY HANDBOOK would be available for distribution on 9/21, that the deans had been discussing allocation of tenure-track lines for next year,

that dollar allocation data for next year would be available for examination, and that additional baseline funding for salaries will be a priority.

The provost distributed the Program Array Review (PAR) Committee charge, answered questions, and acknowledged that the relationship between full-time tenure-track and adjunct faculty loads would be addressed. He explained the proposed composition of the search committee to select a dean for Arts and Sciences, noting that he expects to conduct interviews in Jan. 2002.

Chair Cerny reported that the Faculty Workload Report is available in the Faculty Senate office and that he would be meeting with the chairs of academic governance units on 9/25. He distributed a memo from the faculty representative concerning the ongoing work of the H-R Dimensions Task Force.

The Committee selected faculty to serve on three provost's committees: PAR Advisory, Summer School Administration, and Professional Status of Chairs. The provost assured the Committee that he would share the work of those committees with the Executive Committee.

The Committee approved revisions to standing committees and agreed to select two faculty for the Faculty Dismissal Hearing Committee pool.
