The Theodore Dreiser Distinguished Research/Creativity Award recognizes work substantially completed at Indiana State University by regular, full-time members of the university faculty who have made outstanding contributions to their disciplines. Work completed to satisfy advanced degree requirements is not eligible for consideration. As many as two awards, consisting of a monetary award and a plaque, may be given each year. Faculty members who have previously received the award are ineligible for consideration for a four-year period. Faculty are encouraged to nominate eligible colleagues. 2002 CALEB MILLS DISTINGUISHED TEACHING AWARDS

Nominations for the 2002 Caleb Mills Teaching Awards are now being solicited. A maximum of four awards will be presented during the spring commencement ceremony.

To be eligible for this award, the nominee must be a full-time tenured faculty member who is teaching a minimum of 16 semester hours or 24 contact hours at ISU during the preceding summer, fall, and spring semesters of the current academic year.

Full-time faculty, students, alumni, or administrators may submit nominations. Submissions must include a completed Nomination Form, and a statement on why you believe this nominee should be selected as one of ISU's best teachers, which includes specific examples and/or documents regarding the faculty member's qualities.

2002 FACULTY DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

Nominations for the 2002 Faculty Distinguished Service Awards are now being solicited. A maximum of two awards will be presented during the spring commencement ceremony in May.

To be eligible for this award, the nominee must be a tenured faculty member who has demonstrated service while at Indiana State University in the form of: membership in faculty government at the college/school or University level; membership on committees within the University; service to student organizations; service to professional organizations; and service to community groups.

Full-time ISU faculty, students, alumni, administrators, and citizens of the Wabash Valley may submit nominations. Submissions must include a completed Nomination Form, a letter or statement on why you believe this nominee should be the recipient of a Faculty Distinguished Service Award and the names, addresses, and phone numbers of three to five individuals who can testify to the nominee's service.

BLUMBERG SCHOLARSHIP TO BE AWARDED FOR 2002-2003

One Blumberg Scholarship is awarded annually to an entering freshman. The value of the Blumberg Scholarship is \$1,500 annually and is renewable for four years. Applicants must have SAT score of 1100 or better or an ACT total score of 24 or higher and high school ranking in the upper 10%. Applicants must have a professional interest in children with exceptionalities with the intent to major in Special Education or Communication Disorders through the Department of Communication Disorders/Special Education at Indiana State University. Student will actively participate in Blumberg Center activities (up to 50 volunteer hours per semester) and in student-related activities in the Department of Communication Disorders and Special Education or the Department of Educational and School Psychology. FACULTY GOVERNMENT

FACULTY SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 13, 2001

The Executive Committee met at 3:15 p.m. in Hulman Memorial Student Union (HMSU), Room 227.

Provost Pontius reported that nearly all committees from which he had requested reports were working on their respective charges and that he expected the committee on "special-purpose faculty" to begin its work soon. He indicated a need for faculty representation on committees considering promotions, leaves, and special awards.

Chair Cerny reported on items discussed at the Deans' Council:

- 1) that the provost wished to encourage faculty participation at commencement and would be working to streamline the ceremonies,
- 2) that documents related to academic and administrative effectiveness would be distributed for responses from appropriate committees,
- 3) that Student Credit Hour (SCH) targets were intended to address only overall institutional totals,
- 4) that the Summer School and Status of Chairs committee reports would be sent to appropriate Senate standing committees,
- 5) that revised certificate proposals would be brought to the Executive Committee, and
- 6) that the provost had established a cutoff date of 4/5/02, after which no tenure-track faculty positions would be filled and the searches for those positions would be declared "failed."

Chair Cerny also addressed questions related to the configuration of the Graduate Dean/Graduate School. The provost agreed that faculty representatives to the search committee would be selected by the Administrative Affairs Committee.

Provost Pontius noted that the Summer School committee had been asked to review only issues surrounding compensation and teaching load.

S. Lamb stressed that the Status of Chairs committee had worked very carefully and produced a well-thought-out report. He encouraged the provost to proceed carefully in matters related to "institutional effectiveness," noting that some academic units have accrediting agencies with specific requirements. He urged the inclusion of significant input from deans and chairs. The provost responded that only some units

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have accrediting agencies and that others might benefit from their experience. L. Maule noted that institutional effectiveness analyses had already produced some benefits in her department.

In answer to a question about the relationship between the Graduate School and the Office of Sponsored Programs, the provost said that the configuration was still "fluid." S. Lamb asserted that the two offices should be separate.

The Committee approved motions to:

- 1) send the report from the Summer School committee to FAC,
- 2) send the report from the Status of Chairs committee to FAC and AAC,
- 3) send the Undergraduate Certificate document to CAAC.
- 4) name faculty to serve on Enrollment Management subcommittees

The Committee addressed a question of procedure related to the Promotion and Tenure Document and formulated language to guide the Promotion and Tenure Oversight Committee.

The Committee went into executive session to consider grievances. The Committee came out of executive session and adjourned without taking further action.
