FACULTY SENATE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT FOR **APRIL 30, 2002**

The Executive Committee met at 3:15 in Hulman Memorial Student Union (HMSU) 227.

PROVOST PONTIUS REPORTED:

1) Report of the Blue Ribbon Committee on Distance Education should be ready for consideration by appropriate Senate standing committees during their scheduled summer meetings.

- 2) Deans' Council meets May 1 and will consider a 5-year internal reallocation plan and priorities for compensation. Funds to be reallocated will come from a variety of sources, not just from monies recouped from faculty retirements.
- 3) The administration is interested in additional information about the recently-completed Professional Satisfaction Survey. The Provost will direct his request to the Administrative Affairs Committee for consideration.

CHAIR CERNY REPORTED:

Meetings attended:

Chairs of governance councils

Board of Trustees (4/25-26) -- His statement will be distributed.

Senate officers with Trustees House, Dooley, and Pres. Benjamin -- He will try to arrange additional meetings to pursue issues.

15-MINUTE DISCUSSION PERIOD -- items addressed:

- 1) Study Week -- should changes be made in the policy?
- 2) Encumbrances, payment plans, and student registrations— are changes necessary?

The Committee ACCEPTED:

- 1) SAC report on delays in student financial aid: "...no recommendations at this time, but let the Student Financial Aid Office continue with its plans."
- 2) FAC memo of concern regarding phrasing and implications of revised faculty appointment letter reference to distance education. The memo will be forwarded to the provost for later discussion.
- 3) FAC resolution of concern about the provost's "Proposed Guidelines for Special (Clinical Track) Faculty." The resolution was accepted with the understanding that further discussion will occur.
- 4) AAC recommendation "...that the Executive Committee poll the Faculty Senate as to whether a vote of confidence in the President should be taken." The recommendation will be an agenda item at a later Executive Committee meeting.

The Committee APPROVED:

2) Seating S. Shure, Senate replacement from Technology.

The Committee discussed requirements for graduation with honors by transfer students, and agreed to inquire further.

The Committee went into Executive Session.

The Committee came out of Executive Session and approved the following:

- 1) "The Executive Committee instructs Chair Cerny to meet alone with President Benjamin on 5/2 and, as the president has requested, not follow our usual custom of taking a second member of the Executive Committee to all meetings."
- 2) The Committee acknowledges that Chair Cerny has advised them of his receipt of a grievance.

The next Executive Committee meeting date has not been set, but at least one meeting will take place before each of the scheduled meetings (June and July) of AAC, CAAC, and FAC.
