CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Nominations for the 2008 Caleb Mills Distinguished Teaching Award are now being accepted by the Center for Instruction, Research, and Technology. Full-time faculty, students, alumni, or administrators may submit nominations. Each submission must include a completed Nomination Form and a statement on why you believe this nominee should be selected as one of Indiana State University's best teachers. Specific examples regarding the faculty member's qualities should be described in the statement and may be accompanied by supporting documents.

Excellence in teaching is the sole criterion considered when making this award. A maximum of four (4) annual awards may be given.

Nominations are restricted to tenured faculty, who have taught a minimum of 16 semester hours or 24 contact hours at ISU during the preceding summer, fall, and spring semesters of the current academic year. Previous award winners are ineligible. Faculty members are encouraged to nominate eligible colleagues.
