The Board of Trustees approved a change in title of the academic schools to colleges, effective July 1, 2004. Specifically, the:

School of Business will become the College of Business School of Education will become the College of Education School of Health and Human Performance will become the College of Health and Human Performance School of Nursing will become the College of Nursing School of Technology will become the College of Technology

The School of Graduate Studies will remain the School of Graduate Studies. Please change records, publications, Web sites, and so on to reflect these changes. Materials from the Office of Registration and Records will change as of the first day of Summer Session I as their changes must be tied to the beginning of a term; however, the official date of implementation as approved by the Board of Trustees is July 1, 2004. The transition in signage and documents will take place gradually. Schools may continue to use up supplies of stationary, business cards, and so on with the old titles, to conserve funds.

COURSE ELIMINATIONS

SCHOOL OF NURSING: Baccalaureate and Higher Degree Nursing

- **NURS 306** Group Process for Professional Nursing Practice--2 hours. Understanding and application of group process theory and therapeutic communication strategies in professional nursing practice. Two classroom hours per week. Prerequisite: 300. *Preferred Effective Term: Fall 2004
- NURS 308 Comprehensive Health Assessment of Individuals with Complex Needs --2 hours. Exploration of the relationship among findings from physical assessment, laboratory/diagnostic studies, and symptoms of complex health needs. Implications for nursing care/client teaching are emphasized. Two classroom hours per week. Prerequisites 300, 304.

*Preferred Effective Term: Fall 2004

NURS 420 Nursing Care of Families in the Community--4 hours. Application of public health/public health nursing and family theory in caring for families who are members of vulnerable or high risk populations. Three classroom hours and an average of three clinical hours per week. Prerequisites: 300, 304, 306, 308, 318, and 322.

*Preferred Effective Term: Fall 2004

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UNDERGRADUATE APPROVALS – Course Eliminations: Nursing – continued

NURS 430 Nursing Care of Individuals with Complex Health Needs -- 3 hours. A synthesis of concepts from nursing, the sciences, and the humanities in caring for individuals experiencing acute, high intensity complex illness, and/or continuing health needs. Two classroom hours and an average of three clinical hours per week. Prerequisites: 300; 304; 306; 308; 318; 322; Life Sciences 412; prerequisite or concurrent enrollment in 420.

*Preferred Effective Term: Fall 2004

NURS 480 Professional Development of the Nurse I--1 hour. Self-assessment and planning to promote currency and future-oriented thinking in select areas of nursing study and/or practice. One classroom hour per week. Prerequisites: 300, 304, 306, 308, 318, and 322.

*Preferred Effective Term: Fall 2004

NURS 482 Professional Development of the Nurse II--1 hour. Implementation of plan developed in 480 to promote currency and future-oriented thinking in select areas of nursing study and/or practice. One classroom hour per week. Prerequisites: 300, 304, 306, 308, 318, 322, and 480.
